Guidelines for Abstract submission

The Organizing Committee invites the submission of abstracts for oral presentation and poster display.

New Deadline: 30 June

The abstract topic should be related to conference main sessions (S) highlights:

- S1. Molecular and Supramolecular Structure**
- S2. Cellular Biology and Signaling**
- S3. Biomaterials and Tissue Engineering**
- S4. Innovation and Technology (from diagnostics to therapeutics)**
- S5. Clinical Applications**

The abstract should be written in **English**, with no more than **2000 characters, including spaces**.

Please indicate in the on-line registration form whether you wish an oral or a poster contribution.

Abstracts are exclusively submitted via email.

All accepted abstracts will be published in the Biomedical and Biopharmaceutical Research Journal.

Submission deadline – 30 June 2015



Vetting of abstracts for presentation

Before abstracts are included in the Program they are reviewed by ethical and scientific scrutinizers. Abstracts will either be "Accepted as submitted", or "Rejected outright". Please ensure that your abstract complies with all the submission instructions. Note that the reviewer may ask for justification for certain techniques used in animal experiments; abstracts will be rejected if any doubts about the humanity of the experiments are not resolved.

- **Experiments on animals and animal tissues must declare**

All procedures accorded with current national legislation/guidelines or, in their absence, with current local guidelines.

- **Experiments on humans or human tissue must declare**

All procedures accorded with the ethical standards of the relevant national, institutional or other body responsible for human research and experimentation, and with the principles of the World Medical Association's Declaration of Helsinki.

Components of an abstract

The basic components of an abstract are:

1. Motivation/problem statement
 2. Methods/procedure approach
 3. Results or Methods and Results, i.e., an outline of the technique used to obtain the data, followed by the data obtained
 4. Conclusions/implications

Guidelines for Posters preparation

You can set up your poster any time on September 9th upon your arrival.

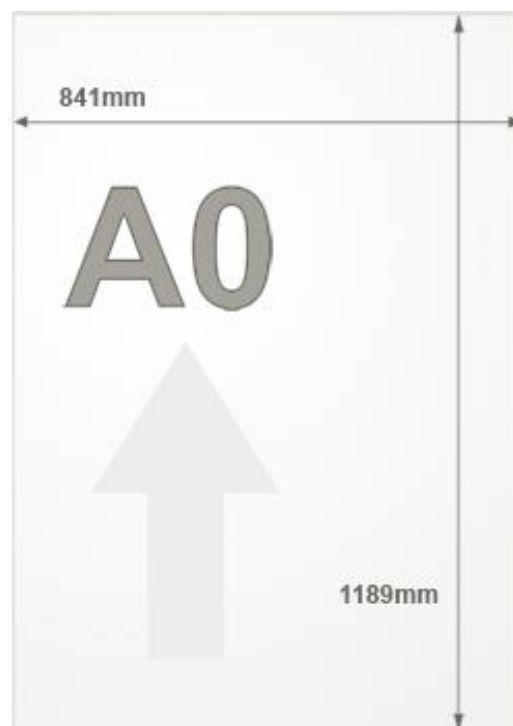
The poster presentations will continuously be on display for viewing during the Conference from September 9 to 12, 2015. Special dedicated hours for poster session are included in the conference program.

If your contribution is selected for the poster session, please follow the following guidelines:

- **Paper size:** Paper size should not exceed A0 format (841 mm x 1189 mm / 33" x 47") in portrait (vertical) set-up
- The poster should be easy to read from a distance of 1.5 m.

Each poster will be allotted a number in the printed material you will receive upon arrival.

Please print the poster on a single large sheet.



LIAC reserves the right to choose the presentation format, to allocate the communication to a session, or to refuse its acceptance
